Parents/Guardians

We ask that you use the Muzodo app to inform the band about your child's attendance and availability for rehearsals and engagements.

Although we are very keen to use social media to engage with audiences and the wider public, we are aware of the dangers of misuse by people. Please do not allow your child to engage in communication with adults within the organisation on social media. If you need to get in touch by email please do so on behalf of your child.

Please go through this code of conduct with your child. You will be asked to confirm that you have agreed to comply with BCBB Policies when creating your child's record on Membermojo.

Young Peoples Code of Conduct

As a member of BCBB we want you to have fun learning to play a brass instrument and working with others in a safe and friendly environment. You are all individuals, and the organisation will not let others bully or do/say things that makes your participation less enjoyable. For this to happen, we expect all members to follow our Code of Conduct.

We ask that you:

Make time to practise your instrument daily and come to rehearsals regularly, in preparation for performances with the band.

Listen when the MD is talking.

Follow instructions.

Do not use your mobile phone during a rehearsal.

Let your MD know as soon as possible if you find you can't attend a rehearsal or engagement.

Be kind to everyone and help others that need support.

Let an adult know straight away if you are having any problems in the band, such as playing the music or other people's actions/words.

Become a valued member of the band by helping to set up and put away chairs and stands when

needed.

Arrive at concerts by the time given, wearing the uniform you have been asked to wear.

Property care:

Always dress smartly for concerts and when representing the band.

Look after your music- make sure it does not get damaged

Take care of your instrument - pack it away carefully and safely. Make sure you are oiling valves,

greasing slides and keeping it clean.

We know that accidents happen - if your instrument gets damaged, please let the band manager

know. Please do not try to fix any damage yourself.

Please don't leave your band instrument in a car overnight as it won't be insured.

If you decide to leave the band, you need to make sure you return everything you have borrowed.

If you are lucky enough to get your own instrument, please return the band one as soon as possible

so someone else can start learning.

If you don't follow the Code of Conduct someone will explain to you what you have done wrong,

and remind you about the Code of Conduct. You will be asked not to do it again and be offered

support.
